Key Stage 3



DofE Bronze Award

Year 9 students are invited to start their Bronze DofE Award. This is an excellent opportunity to develop a wide range of skills and interests. The full Bronze Award costs £150 (paid in 3 instalments; October, February and May). This includes registration with DofE, access to an eDofE account, DofE discount card and regular support with a member of staff to complete the skill, volunteer and physical section. Training and supervision on a one night one day training expedition and supervision and assessment on a two day and one night qualifying expedition in the Peak District. Loan of team kit including tents, trangia, maps, gas and first aid kits. Key Stage 4

GCSE study skills and revision techniques

During personal development and the assembly our Year 11 students have been introduced to effective study skills and revision techniques. This first session re-visited Working Memory, Ebbinghaus Forgetting curve and Dweck's Theory of Growth Mindset and talked the students through how to organise their Home study timetable. Students

who allocate time each week to homework and studying, benefit enormously over those who do not. You can help your child to manage their time and combat future exam anxiety, by establishing a home study timetable with dedicated time for study and time to relax, play sport and spend time with friends and family etc. More details about organising a home study programme can be found on the <u>school website</u>.

Study Planners.

All students in Years 7 to 11 have been issued with a study planner. This should be used to record homework, assignments and important information. There is a section for parent/carer to sign each week, enabling you to monitor how much work your child is being set and the hand in deadlines.

Trial exams for Y11 take place at the start of November. These are an excellent opportunity for your child to practise different revision strategies and get used to the assessment criteria for each subject, before the final exams at the end of Year 11. Our Parent Information Evening on 5th October will show you how to support your child through their GCSE years.

Key Stage 4 Parent Information Evening - Thursday 5th October, 6pm

All parents/carers of students in Years 10 and 11 will be invited to join us in the evening to gain important information about GCSEs and level 2 vocational courses and how to support your child. A letter with further details has been shared via Class Charts.



Weekly English Masterclasses

English Masterclasses began this week for Year 11 and we are expecting Year 10 students to join us from Monday. These sessions are designed to stretch and challenge students by supporting the work done in their English lessons and adopting an A Level standard of text analysis, reading and writing skills.

Key Stage 5

The Oxbridge outreach team were in school on Monday, speaking to our Years 10, 11 and 12 students about the application process and the preparation they can start now if they are thinking of applying to Oxbridge or competitive courses in the future.

Sixth Form Open Evening

Our Sixth Form Open Evening takes place on 19th October, when all Year 11 students will be invited to attend to hear information about the courses we offer as well as wider aspects of our Sixth Form provision.

ASPIRE - Senior Maths Challenge - UKMT

The senior maths challenge will take place on Tuesday 3rd October. Students from Years 13, 12 and some from 11 will take part in an online First Round Challenge. This is a 90 minute challenge with 25 multiple choice questions. The problems on the Senior Maths Challenge are designed to make students think, there are stimulating problems for both beginners and experienced problem-solvers. We've had some fantastic results in previous years and have high hopes for this year's competitors.
