

Art and Design – Photography

Who is this course for?

Anyone with an interest in Art & Design and a desire to develop their knowledge, skills and understanding in this area.

What will I study?

Students will be introduced to a variety of experiences that explore a range of photographic media, techniques and processes. They will be made aware of both traditional and new technologies. Students will explore relevant images, artefacts and resources relating to a range of art, craft and design, from the past and from recent times, including European and non-European examples. Students' responses to these examples will be shown through practical and critical activities that demonstrate their understanding of different styles, genres and traditions. Students use digital workbooks and physical journals to underpin their work. They may wish to develop their drawing skills in order to produce storyboards, thumbnail sketches and/or diagrams, where appropriate. Students use some traditional methods but mainly digital techniques to produce images and video material. Adobe Photoshop and Premier Pro is a crucial tool that students utilise to develop their visual language. Display and installation is also explicitly taught. Students will be aware of the four assessment objectives and of the importance of process as well as product.

Course entry requirements

Five GCSEs at grade 5 or above in different subjects including English and Maths.

How will I be assessed?
