Attendance

As we welcome students back for a new school term, we have been asked by the Department for Education (DfE) to provide you with a clinical and public health perspective on mild illnesses and school attendance. It is usually appropriate for parents and carers to send their children to school with mild respiratory illnesses. This would include general cold symptoms: a minor cough, runny nose or sore throat. However, children should not be sent to school if they have a temperature of 38°C or above. I know it is sometimes difficult to know if it is appropriate to send your child into school or not and therefore the link below provides you with useful advice. Water Bottle Filling Station

We now have a water bottle filling station in the Heart. Students are encouraged to bring in their own water bottle, or other suitable drinking container, and fill it up during their break or lunch time to stay hydrated. In a bid to reduce waste and be kinder to the environment, we are no longer able to provide disposable cups. However, bottled water and other drinks can still be purchased during both the break and lunch time service in the Heart.

Punctuality to Lessons

We continue to have a whole-school drive to ensure punctuality to lessons. It is vital that all students make every possible effort to arrive at their lessons on time. This is because every minute a student is late for a lesson is a minute of lost learning time for them. This can quickly build up when a student is regularly late to their lessons! Students that are regularly late to lessons or school will be issued a 40 minute after school detention.

Equipment Reminder - Your child must have the following equipment with them every day. This supports independent organisational skills and the development of effective learning habits:

- Black pens (at least two)
- Red pen
- Pencil
- Ruler
- Calculator
- Personal Development book and folder
- Subject-specific equipment for the day (subject exercise books, PE kit, food ingredients)

Daily checks of equipment take place and persistent failure to bring these essential items will result in a same day 20 minute detention.
