General Information and Reminders

Punctuality

As you are aware, it is essential that all students arrive on time to school. We ask students to arrive on site for 8:40am, so that they are ready for the morning line up at 8:45am. They will be met and greeted by their tutor then given key messages and information to ensure they are equipped for the day.

We are aware that on rare occasions there may be extenuating circumstances for lateness. We ask students and parents/carers to help anticipate these situations, where possible and inform the school of any potential issues.

To work with both students and their parents, students are met by a member of staff if they are late. Lateness without a valid reason results in sanctions and communication home to ensure that parents/carers are aware of any issues. Thank you for your continued support with this.

Behaviour & Rewards

Well done to our students for continuing to THRIVE and improve the overall conduct of the school! Last term saw a reduction in the number of C3s and C4s for the third consecutive term, which is amazing!

Summer rewards trips will be announced next week and <u>all</u> students will get the opportunity to attend as long as they meet the following criteria:

- 1. Excellent attendance (95%+) from Tuesday 16th April to Thursday 18th July 2024 (no more than 3 days absent)
- 2. Excellent conduct from Tuesday 16th April to Thursday 18th July 2024
- 3. Excellent punctuality to school from Tuesday 16th April to Thursday 18th July 2024

Mobile Phones

All students are expected to have their phone switched off and in their bags at all times on the school site, including at the beginning and the end of the day. From Monday 29th April, any phone not off and in a school bag will be confiscated, even if it is in trouser or blazer pockets. As always, this will include a same-day 20 minute detention and if the problem persists it may escalate to the point where parents are contacted and asked to collect the phone from school.
