





For the Love of Books
















International Firefighters' Day 4th May


UKMT Maths Challenge



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
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Congratulations to our 23 published poets!

French Curriculum - Key Stage 3


At Glossopdale Key Stage 3 students have been familiarising themselves with a new French curriculum using sentence builders.


Sentence builders include ambitious vocabulary in different tenses and have allowed our students to write much more extended pieces of writing.


