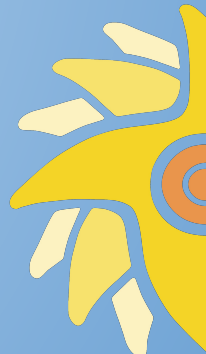
Students were invited down to the secret location, provided with wireless headphones and joined in an impromptu dance with friends on what would have been a normal Monday!

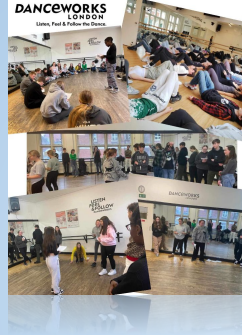

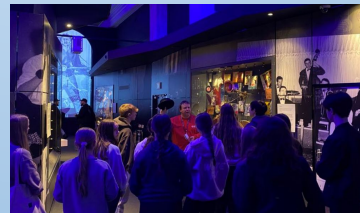


British Music Experience

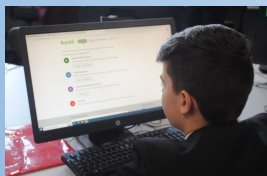
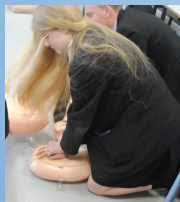

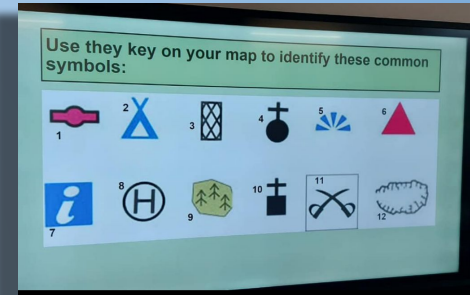

Duke of Edinburgh Bronze Award

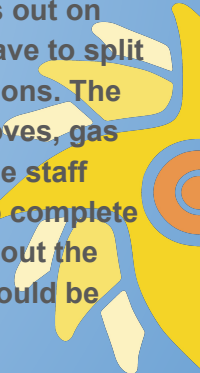


Our year 9 DofE Bronze students are making good progress with their DofE expedition training.

This term we have been working on map skills and navigation. Once they have mastered these essential skills, they will start to plan their expedition routes for the practice on 21st and 22nd June and qualifying expedition on the 11th and 12th July 2024.



Thank you to the PTFA who have recently funded the purchase of 5 brand new 3 man Vango tents for this DofE Award. This additional support has meant that we can now take all 61 of the Year 9 students out on expedition in June and July, and we won't have to split the group over 2 or more separate expeditions. The PTFA have recently funded our Trangia stoves, gas convertors and last year they support the staff development and four teachers were able to complete their Lowland Leader qualifications. Without the support from PTFA our DofE provision would be significantly less.

3D printed Egg Cup holders were also on sale to raise money for Mummy's Star. Great effort by all involved.

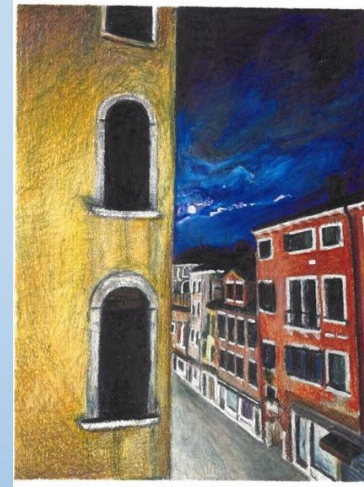
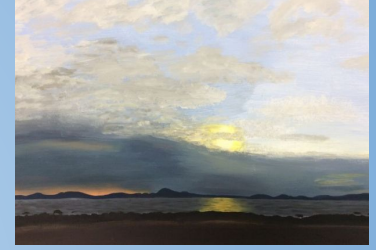
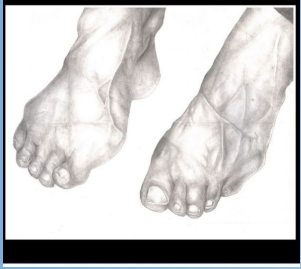

At the Y8 Boys Hub Tournament the Y8 boys team showed great teamwork to play some great football and scored some showstopper goals along the way.

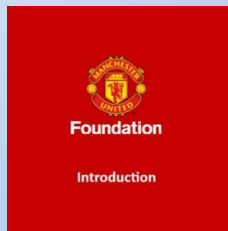
A huge well done to all the boys who were involved, they represented Glossopdale brilliantly and finished 2nd by one point.

Sixth Form THRIVE Day

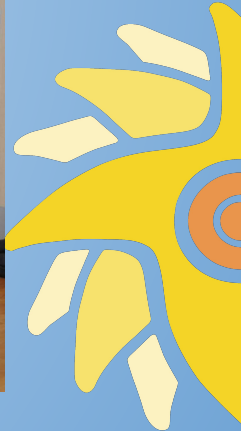
Our Sixth Form participated in a Student Development Day.

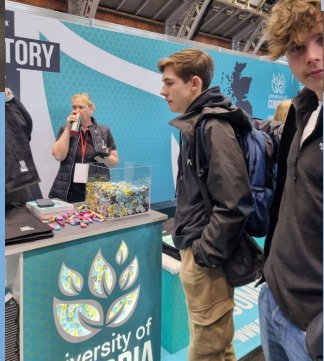
Sixth Form UCAS Discovery Day

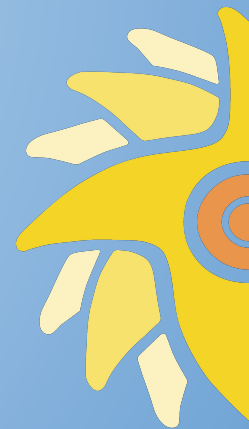
